I also enjoy creating products of all kinds, and have designed everything from toys, to calendars, to formal Private Commissions. Many greeting card companies such as Hallmark and Great Arrow Graphics have featured my work on greeting cards.

Visiting schools and libraries is one of the most rewarding parts of being an illustrator/ author. Using my book illustrations as guides, my presentations take students through the illustration process from first rough sketch to the final published book.

## School Visits

\*All About Illustration (Ages 8-15) With lots of humor and fun, Ann shows students how a single illustration evolves. Students will hear all about sketching, research, color choices materials...and how all that work ends up in a published book.

## \*I Draw the Pictures! (Ages 3-7)

Ann will read from her latest books and show the audience how she made the pictures for them. Ann brings along a giant grab bag, and always makes sure to do some silly sketching, too.
